# What is Cooperative Purchasing & Who Can Use It?

Cooperative purchasing allows state and local agencies ("Authorized User") the ability to replace equipment and services quickly and efficiently in support of their missions and everyday needs.

By definition, a state or local government agency is any city, county, district, or other local governmental body, including state university systems, K-12 public schools and community colleges.

# **Code of Federal Regulation**

### New Terms & Conditions Address Federal Auditing


The recent influx of Federal funding to school districts has also come with a new bidding practice, EDGAR & Uniform Guidance.

The compliance for the school district practitioner is to state Federal Regulatory Code in Chapter 2, Subtitle A, C.F.R. 200. Note, the Department of Education does require Buy American products. The checklist is the following:

- A. How is the project being funded? If it is with any type of ESSER funding then see "B" below. If there is no ESSER funding involved, then the federal bidding clauses do not apply. Is the request for quote going through a Direct Purchasing contract or Public Bidding?
- B. Is the request for quote going through a Direct Purchasing contract or Public Bidding? If...
  - State contracts, for local government default to local procurement governance and must state compliance to EDGAR & Uniform Guidance 2 C.F.R. 200.
  - · Co-Operatives that state in their T&C's EDGAR & Uniform Guidance, then move to "C".
  - · Co-Operatives that do not state EDGAR & Uniform Guidance in their T&C's must obtain three bids.
- C. The EDGAR & Uniform Guidance clause must be a part of the solicitation and the New Terms & Conditions added to Carrier's T & C (see below)

### New Terms & Conditions

Carrier complies with 2 C.F.R. 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards*, which are the regulatory requirements of the Education Stabilization Fund for CRRSA & ARP through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund.



increased VENTILATION

Bringing in more fresh outside air to replace indoor air can help reduce airborne contaminants.



The higher the MERV rating, the more efficient the filter. ASHRAE recommends MERV 13 or higher for K-12 schools whenever possible.



UV lights not only kill pathogens they keep coils clean, which reduces pressure drop and enables the installation of more sophisticated air filters.



Keeping indoor humidity within the ASHRAE 55 suggested range (40% and 60%) can minimize the effects of bacteria and certain allergens.
